



FIVE YEAR SUSTAINABLE ENERGY FOR ALL (SE4ALL) PROGRAM IN TANZANIA TO ACHIEVE ITS SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS (SDG7)

CASE STUDY/INSIGHT

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This is one of the successful project implemented by UNDP. This Five year program with USD 5 billion budget is designed to enable Tanzania to achieve its Sustainable Development Goals (SDG7) in the energy and electricity requirements. Extensive consultations are carried out with more than 250 stakeholders such as the Government Ministries/Departments, international/national donors, academic institutions, finance institutions/banks, private sectors, NGOs, CSOs, women self-help groups, etc. in order to design the project. The program proposes several innovative methods for reaching sustainable development goals. The program also proposes development of special economic zones (SEZ) for RE industries.

Following are the additional benefits:

- At least 10 million households receive electricity access
- About 7 million households receive access to improved cook stoves
- At least 2 million households receive access to modern cooking solutions
- Nearly 500,000 job opportunities created
- More than 150 energy intensive industries benefit through energy conservation
- Additional energy in the grid mix
- Entrepreneurship development for men and women
- Women given equal opportunities to access, participate and benefit from the program
- Innovative micro-capital grants are also proposed to promote renewable energy initiatives in rural communities
